The sensory organs are our built-in tools for gaining knowledge, making discoveries and building intelligence.

How can we introduce each material so that the children will be excited to use them? We also explore ways to extend the use of the materials creatively. How can you combine the wonderful language this area brings to the child, with art and further sensorial exploration?
