AMI Montessori Three to Six Assistants Course

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION

The focus of an Assistant's Work:

- Internationale (AMI) Assistants Course, open to anyone wishing to know more about the Montessori philosophy. The Assistants course highlights the important work of the adult as an aid to the child's development at the crucial early stages of life; knowledge and understanding that could be applied to young children in any setting, including the home environment and as a support to the Guide in a Montessori Children's House (Primary Programme).
- *Programme requirement: High school English proficiency is required.*

Course Structure:

9:00 am to 4:00 pm

- Weeks 1-5: Saturdays (February 20 or 21, 27; March 6,13,20)
- Week 6: Monday, March 22 to Friday, March 26, 2021

Observation:

- In class observation
- Observation hours will be offered within the course schedule. Specific topics will be given for observation assignments.

Requirements for Certification:

- Completion of course
- Album and Materials completed.
- A minimum of 90% attendance is required for certification

Certification Awarded:

- AMI Assistants Certificate (Internationally recognized)
- Eligible for ECE Assistants Certificate from ECE Registry of BC

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The Course Programme:

- The course lectures consist of study on the following Montessori topics:
 - Stages of Development
 - The Prepared Environment
 - The Role of the Guide and Assistant
 - Development of Language
 - Scientific Observation
 - Absorbent Mind
 - Sensitive Periods
 - Freedom & Discipline
 - Development of Independence & Movement
 - Social Development
 - Order & Organization
 - Practical Applications

Duration of the course programme:

- The course will take place *in-person*. 60 hours of course content will be delivered with observation performed during class time.

Required Reading:

- Absorbent Mind (*Montessori-Pierson Edition*)
- The Secret of Childhood (*Montessori-Pierson Edition*)

Additional required reading provided during the course.

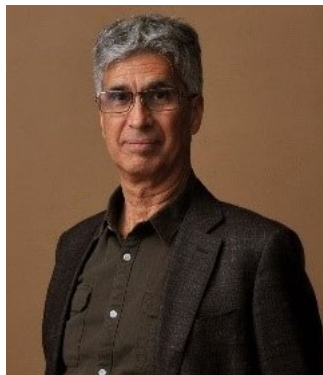
Course work will consist of lectures, the reading of selected Montessori passages, discussion, practical aspects for implementation and the writing of an Assistant's Album. An AMI Children's House Assistants Course Certificate of Completion and transcript will be issued, based upon 90% attendance, course participation and the completion of the Assistant's Album. Transcripts will be provided upon successful completion of the course to apply for the ECEA certificate through the ECE Registry of BC.
