Program Overview:

AMI Montessori Assistants to Infancy Training Course

- The course graduates are prepared to be Montessori Infant Toddler Educators. They have the knowledge to work with parents perinatally, assist with the infant at birth, prepare beautiful and responsive environments, direct Infant Toddler Communities in schools, day care settings and wherever children under the age of three are found!

Program components include:

- **Montessori Pedagogy and Philosophy:** the natural development of the child from conception to three years of age
- **Anatomy and Physiology**
- **Obstetrics:** Prenatal, birth and postnatal development
- **Nutrition and Hygiene:** Maternal care, digestive system, food preparation, and health issues
- **Child Neuropsychiatry:** The Nervous System and normal psychological development
- **Development of Movement and Development of Language**
- Preparation of the **Home Environment and Infant Community** as an aid to human development within the first three
- **Music, Art and Social/Emotional Development**
- **Material making:** the preparation of hand-made materials
- **Observations:** Practical training for observation of infants and toddlers in homes and Infant Communities
- **Practicum in a Montessori Infant Community:** directed by an AMI Assistants to Infancy Diploma holder
- **Preparation of reference and resource albums**

Program Calendar:

This is a full-time academic program with a two-summer format. The course takes place over two summers from the beginning of June to the end of August.

- Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.* with one-hour lunch time. Saturdays may be required).

**Please note: Online scheduling will be different. Daily schedule will be finalized in May.*

Schedule:

First Summer: June 14th, 2021-August 27th, 2021

The first summer's work begins with an overview of Montessori Pedagogy, following the child's natural development, and focusing on the period from conception to age three. Students also study Anatomy and Physiology, Obstetrics, Hygiene and Nutrition in the medical components. Preparation for the Home Environment and materials to support the child's Psychosensory-Motor Developments are carefully studied. Students make materials for children under 12 months, under the supervision of and marked by the Assistants to Infancy Trainers and Course Assistant.

Between the two summers:

The requirements listed below are arranged by the student and discussed with the Trainers. Students complete 250 hours of observation of children from birth to three, at home and in group settings. Each student arranges a Practicum in a Montessori Infant Community directed by an AMI Assistants to Infancy Diploma holder who will evaluate the Practicum. If a visit is required by a course staff member, travel and lodging expenses are the student's responsibility. Observation assignments are handed in regularly during this period. Students must complete and submit the written assignments and paper by the deadlines set out by the Trainers.

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Second Summer: June 13th, 2022- September 2nd, 2022

The second summer furthers the students' knowledge with a study of Child Neuropsychiatry and Community Environments. The focus is on preparation of the Infants Community (for children from 12 to 36 months). Written assignments are handed in regularly throughout the summer. Written and oral exams are given at the end of the second summer. Students are required to practice with the materials under supervision.

- Application form completed, signed and dated
- Application Fee:

- Two pieces Government photo ID (driver's license, passport, etc.)
- Statement of Purpose: please answer the following on a separate page
 - How did you become interested in Montessori Education?
 - What are your goals in taking this Assistants to Infancy Training Program at MTCBC?
 - Please describe your experience with children
- Health Certificate and Immunization Record- Please use the form provided by MTCBC
- Résumé
- Two recent Canadian passport-sized photographs
- Observation Report: a written report of 2-hour observation in an AMI 0-3 Infant Community classroom in your area (if possible)
- Transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended
- References: 3 reference letters either e-mail/mail to the MTCBC directly or provided to you in a sealed envelope. Referees should be an instructor; please provide 2 professional references and 1 personal reference
- Criminal Record Check: complete and sign the form provided and return to MTCBC
- English Language Proficiency: this course is conducted at a university level and the language of instruction is English. Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency by providing one of the following:
 - Proof of post-secondary courses in which the language of instruction is English
 - An IELTS ACADEMIC score of 6.0
 - A TOEFL score of 220 computer testing, 83 internet-based testing or equivalent
- Age requirement: Applicants must be 19 years of age at graduation and have completed Grade 12 OR Mature Student Status (19 years of age or older)
- Personal Interview: upon receipt of all documents, a personal interview will be arranged; the applicant will be asked to write a short essay.

Requirements for Certification:

- Completion of the course requirements includes:
- Attendance at lectures and supervised practice (at least 90% of attendance)
 - 250 hours of observation of infants and toddlers, which includes at least one-week practice in a Montessori Infant Community
 - Material making assignments
 - Written assignments and research papers
 - Reference albums and resource manuals
 - Passing grades on written examinations
 - Passing grade in oral examinations conducted by AMI Examiners

International Students:

Study Permits: Applicants attending the course in Canada for less than six months and returning home between summers will not require a Study Permit. The MTCBC will provide a Letter of Attendance for entry into Canada for the study period for the first summer. A second letter will be provided the following year for the second study period. Applicants may be required to show a return ticket home when entering Canada. Canada Immigration website: www.cic.gc.ca/English/visit/visas.asp
