Program Overview:

AMI Elementary Diploma

The objective of this program is to give you information regarding the Montessori philosophy and approach to child development, the study of Montessori pedagogy and child development as well as an interdisciplinary approach to the study of human beings, their endeavors, and relationships with the universe for children from six to twelve years. The course will provide training in the development of skills one will require to work with elementary aged children in a Montessori Environment. Specific guidance will be given to develop these skills. Upon successful completion of all academic and practicum requirements, graduates will receive their AMI Elementary Diploma.

Program components include:

- Theory lectures on the Montessori philosophy and psychology of child development from ages 0 12.
- Reading/study of Dr. Maria Montessori's books including directed reading seminars
- Presentation lectures on the purpose and use of various Montessori activities and materials
- Supervised and independent practice with the Montessori materials
- Observation in the community and in Montessori classes
- Teaching practice in Montessori schools directed by an AMI Elementary Diploma holder
- Written work students compile a reference album for each of the areas of the prepared environment; the student must complete the assignments given over the duration of the course.
- Material making assignments students make materials for the classroom to keep for their own use

Program Calendar & Pre-requisite Foundation Course:

This is a full-time academic program with a three-summer format. The course takes place in beautiful North Vancouver, over three summers from the beginning of July to the end of August.

Students must participate in webinars, complete, and submit electronic assignments, arrange for observations of children and successfully complete practicum requirements in an Elementary environment directed by a Guide who holds an AMI Elementary Diploma.

Requirements for Certification:

- 90% attendance at lectures, supervised practice, discussions, and reviews and required reading seminars
- Observation and practicum requirements (90 hrs. observation, 120 hrs. practicum)
- Material making assignments
- Written assignments
- Completion of 9 reference albums and resource manuals
- Passing grades on written and oral examinations

International Students:

Study Permits: Applicants attending the course in Canada for less than six months and returning home between summers will not requirea Study Permit. The MTCBC will provide a Letter of Attendance for entry into Canada for the study of the first summer. A second and third letter will be provided the following years of the study period.
