Program Overview

AMI Primary Teacher Diploma AND Early Childhood Education Diploma

- This program trains adults to work with children 3 to 6 years of age and to prepare a beautiful and orderly environment according to the principles and practices of Dr. Maria Montessori and the Association Montessori Internationale.
- Upon successful completion of all academic and practicum requirements, graduates are qualified to receive the BC Early Childhood Educator Certificate.

Program components include:

- Theory lectures on the Montessori philosophy and psychology of child development in the early years
- Reading/study of Dr. Maria Montessori's books including directed reading seminars
- Presentation lectures on the purpose and use of various Montessori activities and materials
- Supervised and independent practice with the Montessori materials
- Observation in the community and in Montessori classes
- Teaching practice in Montessori schools
- Observation and Practicum in a non-Montessori daycare setting
- Compiling a reference album for each of the four areas of the prepared environment and a theory album
- Making materials for the classroom to keep for their own use

Program Calendar

Course Commences on Saturday, May 6th, 2023.

- **Online Lectures:** The course begins with online lectures on Saturday mornings throughout May and June. Further lectures will be scheduled intermittently on Saturday mornings between summer one and summer two, dates TBD.
- **Summer One:** Onsite classes from June 26th - August 25th, 2023, in Vancouver, BC
- **Spring Module:** Two weeks onsite March 15 - March 28, 2024, in Vancouver, BC
- **Summer Two:** Onsite in Vancouver, BC, June 24th - August 23, 2024
- **Written and Oral Exams:** Scheduled in the summer of 2024
- **Montessori Observation and Practice Teaching** completed during the academic year.

These dates may be subject to change if necessary. Any change will be announced in advance and in writing.

- **AMI Primary Teacher Diploma**
- **Early Childhood Education Certificate**
- **Eligible for ECE Certificate from BC ECE Registry**

Certification Requirements

Certification is dependent on completion of the following:

- Maintain a minimum 90% attendance at all online and in-person sessions and supervised practices
- Observation and practicum requirements
- Material making assignments
- Written assignments
- Reference albums and resource manuals
- Passing grades on written and oral examinations



Admission Requirements

- Application form:** completed and signed, online or PDF. Including:
 - **Incl. two pieces of government ID** (passport, driver's license, etc.)
 - **Recent Curriculum Vitae (CV)**
 - **Two recent Canadian passport-sized photographs**
 - **Observation Report:** a written report of a 2-hour observation in a 3-6 Montessori classroom in your area
- Statement of Purpose, please answer the following:**
 - How did you become interested in Montessori Education?
 - What are your goals in taking this Primary Training Program at MTCBC?
 - Please describe your experience with children.
- English language proficiency:** This course is conducted at a university level and the language of instruction is English. **Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency by providing one of the following:**
 - Proof of post-secondary courses in which the language of instruction is English
 - An IELTS ACADEMIC score of 6.0
 - A TOEFL score of 220 (computer testing), 83 (internet-based testing), or equivalent
- Application fee:** Domestic student \$250; International student \$350
- Two references provided online or through reference form supplied by MTCBC**
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended** - sent directly from institution
- Criminal Record Check:** complete e-CRC
- Personal Interview:** after all documents are received, a personal interview will be arranged either in-person, or via Zoom.
- Immunization History** (required for practicum placement)

Tuition Fees

The total tuition fee for all students is **\$17,500 (CAD)** payable as follows:

- **\$1500** non-refundable deposit due upon acceptance
- Three equal installments of **\$5333.33**
 - Due: **May 1st, 2023; October 1st, 2023, March 1st, 2024**

Compulsory fees (CAD) – non-refundable:

- \$ 50 AMI student membership due on May 1st, 2023
- \$ 50 AMI student membership due on March 1st, 2024
- \$ 25 Archive fee due on May 1st, 2023
- \$ 600 Examination Fee due on March 1st, 2024

Additional course expenses may include approximately \$600 for books, supplies, and hand-made materials.
