Program Overview:	AMI Montessori Assistants to Infancy Training Course Course graduates are prepared to be Montessori Infant Toddler Educators. They have the knowledge to work with parents perinatally, assist with the infant at birth, prepare beautiful and responsive environments, direct Infant Toddler Communities in schools, day care settings and wherever children under the age of three are found!
	 Program components include: Montessori Pedagogy and Philosophy: the natural development of the child from conception to three years of age Anatomy and Physiology Obstetrics: Prenatal, birth and postnatal development Nutrition and Hygiene: Maternal care, digestive system, food preparation, and health issues Personality Development: Normal psychological development Development of Movement and Development of Language Preparation of the Home and Nido Environment, and Infant Community as an aid to human development within the first three years of life. Music, Art and Social/Emotional Development Material making: the preparation of hand-made materials Observations: Practical training for observation of infants and toddlers in homes and Infant Communities Practicum in a Montessori Infant Community: directed by an AMI Assistants to Infancy Diploma holder.
	 Community Service: Students volunteer for community service as part of one's observation and practicum hours. Preparation of reference and resource albums
Program Calendar:	 Preparation of reference and resource albums This is a full-time academic program with a two-summer format. The course takes place over two summers, IN-PERSON & ONSITE AT THE MTCBC, from mid-June to the end of August. Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with one-hour lunch time. (Occasional Saturdays may be required). Regular scheduled reference album submissions are required throughout the academic year. Montessori Observation and Practicum hours, and observation summaries to be completed before the second summer. Schedule: First Summer: June 12, 2023 – August 25, 2023 The first summer's work begins with an overview of Montessori Pedagogy, following the child's natural development, and focusing on the period from conception to age three. Students also study Anatomy and Physiology, Obstetrics, Hygiene and Nutrition in the medical components. Preparation for the Home Environment and materials to support the child's Psychosensory-Motor Developments are carefully studied. Students make materials for children under 12 months, under the supervision of and marked by the Assistants to Infancy Trainers and Course Assistant. Between the two summers: 250 hours of observation of children from birth to three, at home and in group settings. Hours must include a 40 hour Practicum in a Montessori Infant Community directed by an AMI Assistants to Infancy Diploma holder who will evaluate the Practicum, and 15 hours of Community Service. If a visit is required by a course staff member, travel and lodging expenses are the student's responsibility.

	 Observation assignments/summaries are handed in regularly during this period. Students must complete and submit scheduled written assignments and papers by the deadlines set out by the Trainers. Second Summer: June 17, 2024 – August 30, 2024 The second summer furthers the students' knowledge with a study of Child Personality Development and Community Environments. The focus is on preparation of the Infants Community (for children from 12 to 36 months). Written assignments are handed in regularly throughout the summer. Written and oral exams are given at the end of the second summer. Students are required to practice with the materials under supervision. 	
Certification Awarded:	 AMI Assistants to Infancy Certificate Infant Toddler Educator Diploma (ECE, Post Basic). Graduates who hold an ECE certificate in British Columbia qualify for the Post Basic Infant Toddler Educator Diploma upon completion of the course. *Of note, if one wishes to become certified in BC, one must complete 80% of the 250 hours of observation and practicum in the province of BC.

English language proficiency: This course is conducted at a university level and the language of instruction is English. Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency by providing one of the following: Proof of post-secondary courses in which the language of instruction is English An IELTS ACADEMIC score of 6.0 A TOEFL score of 220 (computer testing), 83 (internet-based testing), or equivalent 	
	 Two references provided online or through reference form supplied by MTCBC Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended - sent directly from institution

	Personal Interview: after all documents are received, a personal interview will be arranged either in-person, or via Zoom.

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Certification Requirements:	 Completion of the course requirements includes: Attendance at lectures and supervised practice (at least 90% of attendance) 250 hours of observation and observation summaries of infants and toddlers, which includes 40 hours of practicum in a Montessori Infant Community and 15 hours of community service. Material making assignments Submitted and accepted written assignments and research papers Reference albums and resource manuals Passing grades on written examinations Passing grade in oral examinations conducted by AMI Examiners
International Students:	Study Permits: Applicants attending the course in Canada for less than six months and returning home between summers will not require a Study Permit. The MTCBC will provide a Letter of Attendance for entry into Canada for the study period for the first summer. A second letter will be provided the following year for the second study period.
