REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION

The focus of a Montessori Assistant's Work:

Association Montessori Internationale (AMI) Orientation Course, is open to anyone wishing to know about the Montessori philosophy. The Orientation Course highlights the important work of the adult as an aid to the child's development at the crucial early stages of life; knowledge and understanding that could be applied to young children in any setting, including the home environment and as a support to the Guide in a Montessori Children's House (Primary Programme).

Course Structure:

10 Sessions: Saturdays: March 2 - May 20, 2024

Saturdays from 9:00am - 4:30pm

March 2, 9, 16, 23 & 30 April 6, 20 May 4, 18 & 20, 2024 In person Training

****(course will run on Easter weekend & Holiday Monday)***

****Group may be divided in two groups for Material Making depending on group size.***

Observation:

- In-class observation exercises
- Observation hours will be offered within the course schedule. Specific topics will be given for observation assignments.

Requirements for Certification:

- Attentive engagement and active participations throughout the course.
- Album and Materials completed and approved.
- A minimum of 90% attendance is required for certification
- **Cellphone use allowed only during breaks!**

Certification Awarded:

- AMI Orientation Certificate (Internationally recognized)
- Eligible for ECE Assistant Certificate from ECE Registry of BC

Program Requirements:

Programme requirement: **High school English proficiency is required**

One must be 19 years of age by graduation and have Grade 12 or Mature Student Status (19 years of age or older).

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The Course Programme:

The course lectures consist of study on the following Montessori topics:

- Stages of Development
- The Prepared Environment
- The Role of the Guide and Assistant
- Development of Language
- Scientific Observation
- Absorbent Mind
- Sensitive Periods
- Freedom & Discipline
- Development of Independence & Movement
- Social Development
- Development of Order
- Practical Applications

Duration of the course programme:

The course will take place ***in-person at the Montessori Training Centre of BC***

69 hours of course content will be delivered with observation performed during class time.

Required Reading:

The Absorbent Mind (*Montessori-Pierson Edition - required edition*)

The Secret of Childhood (*Montessori-Pierson Edition - required edition*) Additional required reading provided during the course.

Books are an additional cost (approx. \$48.00 CAD), separate from the Material fees.
Available for purchase from the MTCBC or can be purchased from other retailers.

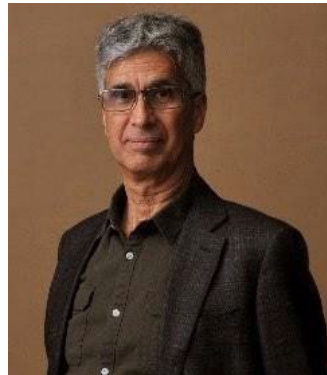
Course work will consist of lectures, the reading of selected Montessori passages, discussion, practical aspects for implementation and the personalizing of a Resource Album and material. An AMI 3-6 Orientation Course Certificate of Completion and transcript will be issued, based upon 90% attendance, course participation and the completion of the Resource Album and material. Transcripts will be provided upon successful completion of the course to apply for the ECEA certificate through the ECE Registry of BC.
