ABOUT US



The **Association Montessori Internationale (AMI)** was founded in 1929 by Maria Montessori to maintain the integrity of her life's work, and to ensure that it would be perpetuated after her death. AMI is the recognized international authority on Montessori education.

During its long history, the AMI has fostered the growth and development of Montessori programs and teacher training and worked to support the development and education of children and young adults in a vast variety of settings throughout the world. AMI is a Non- Governmental Organization (NGO) associated with the United Nations Department of Public Information (since 1985) and an NGO in operational relations with UNESCO (since 1962).

The Montessori Training Centre of British Columbia (MTCBC) works in affiliation with the Association Montessori Internationale (AMI). The courses offered must meet rigorous standards, in both content and teaching staff.

She joined the Montessori Training Centre of BC in September 2019 to complete the final phase of the Training of Trainers Programme at the primary level and is now an AMI Primary Trainer and the Primary Director of Training at the MTCBC.

THE FOCUS OF A MONTESSORI GUIDE'S WORK

This program trains adults to work with children 3 to 6 years of age and to prepare a beautiful and orderly environment according to the principles and practices of Dr. Maria Montessori and the Association Montessori Internationale. Upon successful completion of all academic and practicum requirements, graduates receive the internationally-recognized AMI Primary Diploma, and are qualified to receive the BC Early Childhood Educator Certificate.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

THE COURSE COMPONENTS CONSIST OF STUDY ON THE FOLLOWING MONTESSORI TOPICS:

- Theory lectures on the Montessori philosophy and psychology of child development in the early years
- Reading/study of Dr. Maria Montessori's books including directed reading seminars
- Presentation lectures on the purpose and use of Montessori activities and materials
- Supervised and independent practice with the Montessori materials
- Observation in the community and in Montessori classes
- Teaching practice in Montessori schools
- Observation and Practicum in a non-Montessori daycare setting
- Compiling reference albums for the four areas of the prepared environment and on Montessori theory
- Making materials for the classroom to keep for your own use



REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION

CERTIFICATION IS DEPENDENT ON COMPLETION OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Maintain a minimum 90% attendance at all online and in-person sessions
- Supervised practice requirements
- Observation and practicum requirements
- Material making assignments
- Written assignments
- Reference albums and resource manuals
- Passing grades on written and oral examinations

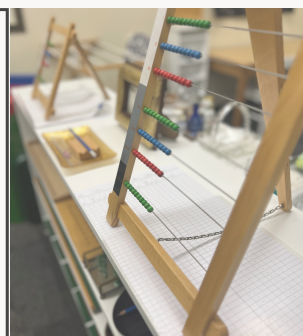
- AMI PRIMARY DIPLOMA (internationally recognized)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This is a blended academic program which means some components will be presented online and some in person. The blended format allows adult professionals reduced time away from home and work. In-person components take place in beautiful Vancouver, B.C.

The Montessori Primary & ECE Program prepares learners to work with children ages 3-6 years using Dr. Maria Montessori's methods and theory. Adult learners will engage in a concentrated course that blends online and in-person learning. There will be live, in-person lecture seminars, discussion, practical training with Montessori materials, observation, and practice teaching – as well as synchronous and asynchronous online work.

MONTESSORI 3-6 PRIMARY COURSE

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Application form completed, signed, and dated
- Application Fee (CAD):
 - Local \$250; International student \$350
- Two pieces of government-issued photo IDs
- Health Certificate and Immunization Record- Please use the form provided by MTCBC
- Résumé
- Two recent Canadian passport-sized photographs - digital
- Transcript from all post-secondary institutions attended (*mail or e-mailed directly from post-secondary institution to the Training Centre).
 - Official Transcripts (with English translations if applicable)
- 1 reference letter from a personal source, either e-mailed/mailed to the MTCBC directly or provided to you in a sealed envelope
- 2 Letters of Recommendation from someone who has worked with you in a supervisory role addressing the following points:
 - Academic skills for success in the comprehensive and rigorous course of study
 - Clear oral and written communication
 - Capacities for organization and time management
- Canadian Ministry of Justice Criminal Record Check: complete e-CRC
- English Language Proficiency: this course is conducted at a university level and the language of instruction is English. Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency by providing one of the following:
 - Proof of completion of post-secondary courses in which the language of instruction is English
 - An IELTS ACADEMIC score of 6.0
 - A TOEFL score of 220 computer testing, 83 internet-based testing or equivalent
- Statement of Purpose. Please write an essay answering the following questions:
 - What is your experience with Montessori education at this age?
 - What influenced your decision to pursue the study of Montessori education at this age level?
 - Why have you chosen the MTCBC to pursue your Montessori Teacher Training?
- Personal Interview: upon receipt of all documents, a personal interview will be arranged. Once the interview has been completed, the Admissions Committee will meet, and an offer of acceptance may be made.
