Course Objectives:

The 0-3 Orientation Course intends to help interested adults become assistants in a home Montessori Nido or Infant Community. The Assistant's task is not to give initial presentations of the materials but rather to support and help the Directress maintain the equilibrium within the class, do follow-up work and language work with the children and helping maintain order within the environment. The 60-hour Orientation Course will include a series of lectures, observations and activities to assist in understanding and supporting Montessori philosophy.

The focus of the prepared adult's work:

- To observe
- To learn when & how to intervene (not interfere) with the children
- To acquire the ability to allow the children to become more independent "Any unnecessary help is a hindrance to development".
- To gain knowledge of Montessori's understanding of Freedom and Discipline
- To learn how to gain the children's trust
- To understand the power of the absorbent mind
- To understand the importance of consistency (also related to the use of language) and routines.
- To understand the importance of the outdoor and indoor environment
- The importance of food and food preparation

Duration of the Course Programme:

 Sixty hours of course lectures and coursework completed synchronously and asynchronously online; nine additional hours of observation of a child/children under 3.

Course Structure:

February 4, 6, 11, 13, 18, 20, 25, 27, 28, 2025
Tuesdays & Thursdays at 4:00 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. PT (Pacific Time)

- Online Synchronous Sessions: 40 hours of seminars, discussions, lectures, observation exercises, and group activities held online
- Asynchronous Sessions: 11 hours of videos, readings and assignments according to the course schedule from February 4 -28, 2025
- Observation: 9 hours of observation of a child/children under the age of 3 arranged independently by the student (notes are required).



Requirements to receive an

A.M.I. Orientation Certificate

- Submission of one written paper (500 words) to be completed by date stipulated by the course director.
- To obtain the 0-3 Orientation Certificate, a minimum attendance of 90% is required.
- 9-hours of observation of child(ren) under the age of 3 years (notes are required).
- Digital Album of the Course (PDF, Google Documents or Word Document).
- One electronic device with a camera
