Course Objectives:

Association Montesssori Internationale (AMI) Orientation Course, is open to anyone wishing to know about the Montessori philosophy. The Orientation Course highlights the important work of the adult as an aid to the child's development at the crucial early stages of life; knowledge and understanding that could be applied to young children in any setting, including the home environment and as a support to the Guide in a Montessori Children's House (Primary Programme).

Observation:

• 9 hours of observation parallel to the course. Observations to be completed in a Montessori Casa 3-6 classroom. Specific topics will be given for the observation assignments.

Requirements for Certification:

- Completion of course
- Submission of three papers (500 words each) on topics set by the course director and to be submitted by a date set by the course director.
- A minimum of 90% of synchronous attendance is required for certification and 100% asynchronous & observation hours must be completed.
- *All tasks must be completed for certification

Admission Requirements:

- One must be 19 years of age at graduation and have Grade 12 OR have Mature Student Status (19 years of age or older)
- High School level English is required as translators are not permitted
- Completion of a course application
- Photocopy of one Government ID with photo (driver's license, passport, birth certificate, etc.)
- A non-refundable application fee of \$250, tuition fee of \$1000 (refundable if unable to attend and 10 business days' notice is given)
- Student Enrolment Contract

- Eligible for ECE Assistant Certificate from ECE Registry of BC





Primary Orientation Course Trainer

Teng-Chien is an international Montessori trainer, originally from Taiwan. He began his career as a licensed Clinical Social Worker within elementary school communities where he met his passion for Montessori. He taught English in Montessori schools in Taipei and from there he came to the US where he obtained first his Assistant to Infancy AMI diploma, and then his Primary AMI diploma under the guidance of Joan Bettmann. He served as a 0-3 guide and a Children's House guide and a pedagogy director in the



US, Taiwan and China. Teng-Chien subsequently became an AMI Primary Trainer, and has taught Primary Orientation Courses in Taiwan. He also served as an observer and consultant in Hong Kong, Thailand, and Singapore. Since 2019, Teng-Chien has given three Primary training courses in Denver and is currently directing courses in Maryland and Thailand.
